Wetstat 2023 Principal Survey Results

9 out 10 principals agreed that corps members have a positive impact on students' academic growth; students' personal growth; and students' development of positive social identities.

97% of principals were satisfied with the Teach For America alumni in their schools.

93% agreed that they contribute to a positive, collaborative professional culture at their school. As we step into November, we reflect on the past two months filled with excitement as students returned to schools across Massachusetts. We're so proud of our diverse network of over 2,850 exceptional alumni and corps, who have shown incredible dedication and passion; both inside and outside classrooms.

The recent findings from the <u>Westat report</u> highlight the unwavering commitment and impact of their work, with over 1,100 principals affirming the effectiveness and positive contributions of <u>TFA teachers</u>, including both corps members and alumni. According to the report, nine out of ten principals agree: Teach For America corps members make a profoundly positive impact on students.

Beyond the statistics, is our ability to collectively learn what works to support students' needs and create a future filled with possibilities. As we continue to navigate the educational landscape, we draw inspiration from the growing impact of our network as Teach For America continues to partner with local schools, serving as a talent pipeline supporting student success.


