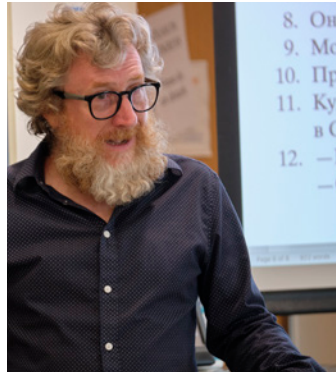

AM I ELIGIBLE?

High school graduates to ages 80+, from beginner to advanced, are eligible to apply.

HOW LONG AND WHEN ARE THE PROGRAMS?

Most programs are seven or eight weeks long starting at the end of June and going through mid-August. Shorter programs are offered in Abenaki, Hebrew, and Russian.

WHERE ARE YOU LOCATED?

Middlebury creates one of the most effective language-learning environments in beautiful Middlebury and Bennington, Vermont. English is located in Monterey, California.



DO YOU HAVE FUNDING?

Middlebury College offers generous fellowships, scholarships, and financial aid for our students. Partial need-based financial aid is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Aid is in the form of grants, not loans, and does not have to be paid back.

CAN I GET COLLEGE CREDIT?

You can receive nine credits for the seven-week programs and 12 credits for the eight-week programs.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL DAY LOOK LIKE?

Live on campus with fellow language students and faculty. Eat meals with your professors, take classes four to five hours in the morning, and spend your afternoons in activities that enhance your cultural understanding. In the evenings, enrich your learning experience with lectures, film screenings, performances, and tutoring sessions.

WHAT DO STUDENTS DO ON WEEKENDS?

Take part in cultural events, celebrations, dances, excursions, and special programs.

WHAT'S NEXT?

You will have access to the Center for Careers and Internships (CCI) as well as an international network of alumni. Students go on to a variety of careers, leveraging their language skills to stand out in the job market.

Students also consider our Language Schools master's programs, which are flexible and affordable and offer international options.
